

#### Who We Are

- An emergency food service that supplies 3-5 days of food per month to Orangeville and area residents
- Opened in 1992 by community members
- Located at 3 Commerce Road, Unit 5/6 (Across the road from Alzheimer Society, behind Georgian College)
- Open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from 10:00 am – 1:00 pm and Wednesday's from 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm




#### **Dufferin Food Share**

- Community collaboration to provide a central access point for food insecure residents for healthy nutritious food support to help limit exposure
- Partnering with Salvation Army New Hope Church, Grand Valley Food Bank, St. Vincent De Paul Society – St. Timothy Church, The Café, St. Mark's Anglican Church, Lavender Blue Catering, Westminster United Church and the Children's Foundation of Guelph Wellington
- Providing two weeks of food support including additional food for children twice a month
- Offering Drive thru/ Walk thru or Delivery service

## **Facilities**

- New building @3 Commerce Road offering 7200 sq ft warehouse space including 400 sq. ft of cold storage enables us to share food with local residents and community agencies
- 112 sq. ft of dedicated office space for community agencies
- Children's play room
- Commercial Kitchen for teaching and food prep
- Board room available for community meetings
- Space for future on site gardens
- We are a member of Feed Ontario and Food Banks Canada.
- We are inspected annually by the local Health Unit



# **Programs & Partnerships**

- Community Food Share that supports local 20 + community agencies with food including FTP, CLD, Choices and Lighthouse
- Monthly Fresh Food Markets for Seniors
- Fresh Food for Kids & Kid zone Additional perishable foods including yogurt, cheese strings, fruit and vegetables
- Non perishable food boxes supplied to DAFHT & LHIN for clients in need
- Community gardens at Edelbrock Centre & Dufferin Garden Center
- Partnership with Urban Harvest & Sustainable Orangeville to distribute excess fruits and vegetables



# Leadership

- A Board of Directors over sees the organization, maintaining high governance standards
- Two full time staff include the Executive Director and Food Manager
- We have over 125 volunteers supporting all facets of the operation including volunteer coordination, warehouse management, client services, administration and pick ups & deliveries



## Clients

- On average we have 700 clients each month 31% are children
- We serve our neighbours, friends, children, community members
- During the past five years we have seen a 82% increase in people needing food assistance
- 97% increase since 2015 in individuals who identify employment as their primary source of income
- The fastest growing group for food bank use is seniors
- 246,000 lbs. of food were received last year
- Perishable food makes up 50% of what we distribute
- 54,000 lbs. of food was shared with local community agencies



### **Donations**

- Donations of food
  - Community food drives, grocery store bins, Waterloo Food Distribution Network
  - Baked goods (Zehrs, Sobeys, Ray's Bakery, Tim Hortons)
  - Community Garden produce
  - Local donations of fresh fruit and vegetables, eggs and milk
  - Other sources
- Cash donations
- The Orangeville Food Bank received support in the amount of \$10,000 from the Town Of Orangeville and \$3000 from Dufferin County this year. We are extremely grateful for this support.

#### **RESOURCE** definitions:

*Noun:* a stock or supply of money, materials, staff, and other assets that can be drawn on by a person or organization in order to function effectively.

Verb: provide (a person or organization) with materials, money, staff, and other assets necessary for effective operation.

**Examples include**: communication platforms, equipment, expertise, furniture, gardens, materials, money, indoor space, outdoor space, staff ...
