


OUR SHARED VISION:

Integrated Covid Response



- Our OHT has continued to support and offer Covid Response Centres across Dufferin and Caledon, ensuring that the community has broad and consistent access to COVID assessment, testing, and vaccinations.
 - Primary Care vaccination pilot in Caledon saw over 320 people vaccinated in March
 - In July, 11 OHT partner organizations, 9 physicians, and numerous volunteers quickly mobilized to stand up a weekend-long vaccination blitz to increase equitable access and boost vaccination rates in Caledon a true example of a community coming together and working in partnership to meet the needs of residents. In all, over 1,060 doses were administered.
 - Now operating in a steady state, supported by OHT community partners, current volumes at our integrated response site are approximately 100-120 vaccinations/week, and 60-80 swabs/week



Delivering for our Mental Health and Addictions priority population



- Addictions sub-group led an Anti-Stigma campaign that was launched on August 31st
- Children and Youth Mental Health issued a call to action asking the children and youth in our community to share their stories,
 experiences, and what they have learned about themselves and mental well-being during the pandemic
 - Submissions were used to create the COVID 19 Lessons: kid2kid video series, which can be seen on www.covidlessons-kid2kid.com
- Dufferin Caledon Integrated Crisis Network offers a collaborative crisis response to individuals to ensure that the right assessments and interventions are offered at the right time
- Fully implemented DCAFS crisis response to 24/7 allowing for assessments of children and youth in hospital during the late evening and early morning hours and avoiding unnecessary overnight stays in the ER

Delivering for our Mental Health and Addictions priority population ... continued



- Our Community Response Group, mobilized during the COVID-19 pandemic as a collaborative response to the local needs of community and service providers, continued to double down on COVID recovery, as well as the wellbeing and resilience of health human resources, with initiatives including:
 - Two workshops on mental health resiliency for front line health care and social service workers (226 total participants)
 - Hosting a recognition event in collaboration with Orangeville Theatre
 - Hosting a remembrance and recognition event in support of frontline workers at the Shelburne Residence
 - Sponsoring the Psychological PPE program offered to 200 front-line providers of health and social service organizations across Dufferin Caledon
- The Congregate Settings sub-group was formally integrated within our Community and Mental Health Support Services Working
 Group, and continues to focus on congregate and community provider recovery that ensures continuity of care for people

Caregivers in the Hills Program



- As of July 23rd, 2021, 38 Caregivers enrolled in the Program, referred through Dufferin Child and Family Services and the Alzheimer's Society of Dufferin County
- 117 participants completed an e-learning module for health care providers:
 Understanding the Role of the Caregiver
- On September 22nd, 2021, our Community Wellness Council presented on our Caregivers program at the Ontario Caregivers Forum

Phase 1:

Development & Testing

- Implementing the program with two Ontario Health Team partners - the Alzheimer's Society of Dufferin County and Dufferin Child and Family Services
- Develop a secure application for data collection from caregivers
- Educate and track learning of local health care providers on the role of the caregiver
- Onboard caregivers from the two OHT partners and provide them with an identification badge

Phase 2:

Learning & Widening

- Widen participation to larger OHT partner organizations that will have greater impact and reach more unpaid caregivers in the community
- Onboard the Dufferin Area Family Health Team to assist in identifying caregivers
- Develop an education Toolkit accessible to all OHT partners
- Build awareness of the program with health care providers and the local community (Communications Plan)
- Onboard local businesses/retailers to promote the program by offering rewards/perks to caregivers


