






Our Vision



The First Local Food Summit and Local Food Trade Show is held, leading to the formation of Headwaters Food and Farming Alliance: Hub, Terms of Reference, membership roster, working groups, initial priorities. Second summit held in 2013.

Headwaters Food Charter is published

Following wide public and multi-sector consultation, the local food charter is developed, featuring 6 pillars, 15 goals and 27 actions. 2017 Headwaters Farm Fresh local food guide and map is launched. Published annually with ITH.




MEMBERSHIP
